I want to thank you for all of your past support of our programs, such as the Interfaith March for Peace & Justice. We are excited to announce our upcoming fundraiser, the **Summer International Music, Dance and Art Festival, on Sunday, June 27th, 4:00 to 6:00 PM**, a hybrid-virtual event benefiting the <u>Institute for Religious Tolerance, Peace and Justice</u>.

Our objective for this event is to raise enough funds to support our programs. Among these are the Interfaith March for Peace & Justice, which is the largest coalition of interfaith marches in the world. Your contribution will go to support infrastructure for the marches in our coalition, as well as to restart the mini-grant program whereby funds can be shared with some of the member marches that are in the hardest hit, most economically depressed areas of the world. These marches are led by some of the most effective and passionate folks in the world, but they can truly benefit from additional funding to help ensure that their expenses are paid and their marches are facilitated. People like Mohamed Jamous, who runs a march in Bethlehem (Palestine), the birthplace of Jesus of Nazareth; Sylvia Acan, of Golden Women International, based in Uganda; Hussein Ali in Jammu Kashmir; Geoffrey Manasseh and Nicholas Utale of Malawi; and Abdussamad Moaz of The House of Peace Pakistan. With your help, we can help these people continue their good work.

We have a whole host of programs that aim to increase religious literacy among the general public, combat hatred and ignorance, as well as solidify peacebuilding efforts already underway. Some of our other programs that require support are as follows: (1) the Interfaith Ambassadors program, which brings college students and non-collegiate adults alike to various houses of worship to help expose them to a variety of faiths for the sake of religious and cultural literacy, helping us to combat intolerance and miseducation; (2) the Our Muslim Neighbors Forum that has provided panel discussions of Muslims, answering questions about their faith, making this available to people through institutions of higher learning and churches alike; as well as (3) a new project to film high resolution virtual tours of numerous houses of worship, hosted by the
